Background

- Success of Warden Scheme in Holyland area – 40% reduction in ASB in 1st year
- Belfast City Council Objective - Creating a Safer City
- Introduction of new service to tackle Anti Social Behaviour across the city



How can wardens help?

- We will provide advice and reassurance
- We will put in place measures to tackle Anti Social Behaviour
- The types of things we will try to deal with include noise, litter, dog fouling, vandalism and unruly behaviour



Working with others

- The wardens will try to deal with many issues there and then
- To solve some problems we will need help from other organisations such as NIHE, other Council departments and the local community
- All crimes should be reported to police on 0845 600 8000 or phone Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111



How wardens will work

- Four teams of three wardens, 1 senior and 2 regular will operate in North, South, East and West Belfast
- Teams will work in smaller areas of 20 streets for 2/3 months
- Areas will be identified through agreement between communities, local groups and other agencies.

- 4 Senior Community Safety Roaming Wardens
- 8 Community Safety Roaming Wardens
